

Misrepresentation

CETYS University is committed to conducting all institutional operations with integrity, transparency, and accuracy. In accordance with Title IV of the Higher Education Act, as amended, and federal regulations under 34 CFR §§ 668.71–668.75, CETYS University strictly prohibits substantial misrepresentation in all communications related to its educational programs, financial charges, financial assistance, and the employability of its graduates.

For purposes of this policy, misrepresentation is defined as any false, erroneous, or misleading statement made directly or indirectly to a student, prospective student, member of the public, accrediting agency, state agency, or the U.S. Department of Education. Misrepresentation includes statements that omit material information in such a way that the statement becomes false, erroneous, or misleading. A statement may constitute misrepresentation even if it is true on its face but presented in a manner that is likely to deceive.

This policy applies to all institutional representatives, including administrators, faculty, staff, admissions personnel, financial aid personnel, marketing representatives, and any third-party servicer, contractor, or external organization with whom CETYS University has an agreement to provide educational programs, marketing, advertising, recruiting, admissions, or related services. CETYS University does not permit the dissemination of student endorsements or testimonials obtained under duress or as a condition of participation in any institutional program or activity.

NATURE OF EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

CETYS University provides accurate and complete information regarding the content, structure, duration, accreditation, transferability, and requirements of its academic programs. All undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral programs are described in official institutional publications and on the university's official website. Program descriptions are reviewed periodically to ensure accuracy and consistency with approved curricula and applicable accreditation standards.

The institution does not misrepresent the nature of its educational programs, including the level of academic preparation required, prerequisites for admission, degree requirements, or the recognition of credentials. Any statements concerning academic quality, accreditation status, or program outcomes are supported by verifiable institutional data.

NATURE OF FINANCIAL CHARGES

CETYS University provides clear and transparent information regarding tuition, fees, insurance requirements, transportation services, and any additional mandatory or program specific charges. Tuition rates and applicable fees are reviewed and published annually. The method used to calculate tuition whether on a per-credit, per-unit, or per-course basis is clearly disclosed.

The institution does not misrepresent the cost of attendance, the customary nature of any charge, or the institutional refund policy. Information regarding refunds in the event of withdrawal is published in accordance with federal Return of Title IV (R2T4) regulations and institutional policy.

CETYS University does not make false or misleading statements concerning the availability, amount, or conditions of scholarships, grants, or other financial assistance. Students are informed that financial aid awards are subject to eligibility requirements and applicable federal and institutional regulations. Students retain the right to accept, decline, or request a reduction of any Title IV loan or other form of financial assistance offered to them.

In compliance with federal regulations, the Financial Aid Office reviews documentation submitted in support of financial aid applications and reports suspected cases of fraud or deliberate misrepresentation affecting Title IV eligibility to the appropriate authorities, including the Office of Inspector General when required.

Federal loan information is reported to the National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS), and borrowers may access their records through the U.S. Department of Education's official student aid website.

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

- Tuition is calculated on a per-credit basis. Each course has a specific number of credit units, and the cost per unit is established annually and applied to the corresponding academic year.
- Registration Fee: It is a fixed amount that applies each semester to all degree programs; however, in Engineering the amount is slightly higher
- Insurance: The insurance fee is paid every six months and is used to pay for the policy, which has three types of coverage: Major Medical Expenses Insurance, Personal Accident Insurance, and Guardian Death Insurance.
- Global Programs: For Industrial Engineering Global Program and the Bachelor's Degree in International Business Global Program, an additional fee is added, which is calculated based on the cost per unit.
- Transportation: CETYS offers some transportation services for specific routes with higher demand. This service is subcontracted and paid for on a semi-annual basis; the cost may vary depending on the destination.

- Additional Mandatory fees cover student services, technology access, and institutional facilities. Additional charges may apply for laboratory courses, international programs, and specialized academic resources.

ADULT UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM AND GRADUATE PROGRAM

Adult Undergraduate and Postgraduate tuition fees are calculated based on a fixed cost per subject, which is released each year. The cost varies between campuses depending on the target audience. International courses have a higher tuition fee, which is paid at the destination university.

- Tuition: Is calculated on cost-per-subject basis; may vary per Campus.
- Insurance: For some Athletes, Major Medical Expenses Insurance, Personal Accident Insurance may apply if they do not have personal insurance of their own.
- Transportation: CETYS offers some transportation services for specific routes with higher demand. This service is subcontracted and paid for on a semi-annual basis; the cost may vary depending on the destination.
- Additional Mandatory fees cover student services, technology access, and institutional facilities. Additional charges may apply for laboratory courses, international programs, and specialized academic resources.

The financial aid Department carefully reviews all financial support documents for possible errors or discrepancies - including intentional misrepresentation or fraud. Due to federal regulations, our institution is required to inform the Department of the Office of the Inspector General of USA (OIG) any person suspected of fraud or deliberate misrepresentation of the information that may affect the eligibility of a applicant for the credit of Title IV

By accepting Title IV financial aid, students acknowledge their understanding of applicable federal regulations and institutional policies governing such aid.

CETYS University reports all information of federal loans, whether it's credit by the student or their parents, to the national system of credits for students (NSLDS) where borrowers may access information regarding their federal loan history and the institutions authorized to report such data.
